Year 6 - Summer Curriculum Newsletter

Welcome back to school; we are very much looking forward to our final term of learning with the Year 6 children. Please find below some key information about the Summer term and our expectations. Homework:

Our expectation at Broadford is that every child should do the following every night:

- 15 minutes reading to themselves or an adult (signed in the reading record)
- 15 minutes practising spellings in their spelling book
- 15 minutes rehearsing times tables facts on Times Tables Rockstars

SATs Boot Camp:

All children have now received login details for [SATs Boot Camp](#), which is an online platform designed to prepare children for their end of key stage assessments and support with their revision of all topics they have covered in maths and literacy. We strongly encourage all children to work through the topics at home, especially to help with any missed learning due to the pandemic.

Mathletics:

All children have their [mathletics](#) information. Please continue to encourage the children to use this online platform to consolidate their mathematical knowledge.

Spellings:

Spellings will be given out on Mondays. The children should practise their words every evening. Spelling books must be brought in on Fridays, which is also when the weekly test happens. This will be closely monitored.

P.E Lessons/ Forest School:

On **Tuesdays**, children are expected to come in appropriate PE uniform for their lessons in the afternoon - black/grey/navy shorts or trousers and a white polo shirt. All children will continue to participate in Forest School, which will also take place on Tuesday afternoons. Please make sure that children come to school in weather appropriate attire (**including bringing in old trainers/ boots/ wellies for Forest School**), so that they can fully enjoy the sessions, even on a rainy day!

Summer Sun:

We are very lucky to be experiencing this warmer weather so early in the Summer term. I would like to ask all parents to ensure that children have sun protection applied before they arrive at school. It is also recommended that children bring caps/hats into school to wear during outdoor times. Please also make sure that the children have a clearly labelled water bottle, so that they can stay hydrated.

School Uniform:

It has been wonderful to see the year 6 pupils return to school looking very smart in their school uniform. Please be reminded that the school colours are grey, black and navy. All school uniform is available through [Premier School Wear](#). Please label all items of clothing, especially school jumpers.
